

- 1. You will need to develop a mechanism reporting this service for billing purposes**
- 2. Detailed documentation, that you provided this service, will need to become part of your procedure documentation**
- 3. Payment for your procedures in 2017 will be reduced to reflect unbundling of the moderate sedation. The only way to maintain your current payment for your procedures is to provide this service yourself**
- 4. Medicare's final fee schedule for 2017 will reflect this reduction**

"ICD-10-CM 2017 is here. There are 1,943 new codes, 422 revised codes and 305 deleted codes. Medicare's moratorium on using specific diagnosis codes expired October 1, 2016. Medicare will now require your billing to provide more specific diagnosis codes than they have for the past year. Does your provider's documentation support using more specific codes? Using "unspecified" diagnoses may trigger payment denials or audits."

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Obtaining Rightful Payments From Insurances.

- Cardiology Specific procedures, such as Cardiac Cath and PCI's discussed and coded for maximum reimbursement.
