# THE NEW YORK CARDIOLOGICAL SOCIETY'S 2023 YOUNG INVESTIGATORS'/CASE PRESENTERS' AWARD COMPETITION

- Any **Fellow-in-Training (FIT)** who is currently enrolled in a cardiovascular fellowship training or an advanced cardiology subspecialty training program or any current **resident** or **medical student** who has participated in cardiovascular research in New York State may compete in the NYACC Young Investigators/Case Presenter Competition.
- The scientific abstracts receiving the highest scores will be displayed as posters during the Annual Young Investigators Competition poster showcase aboard a yacht that will sail around NYC this year. The tentative date is 10/20/23.

The top three **poster awardees** will be invited to present their work as a short (3-5 minute) oral presentation and will receive a \$200 cash award, a winner's certificate, and a grant to cover travel expenses and one night's lodging in NYC if needed. The event is tentatively scheduled for **Friday, Oct. 20, 2023**, aboard Cloud Nine IV yacht.

- The best **clinical case** will also be selected for a brief oral presentation at the same meeting.
- Scientific abstracts previously presented at national scientific sessions **may** be submitted.
- There is no limit to the number of abstracts/cases that can be submitted by an individual.
- The deadline for abstract/case submission is **5 p.m. Eastern on Friday, Aug. 25, 2023.** Submissions will be evaluated by a committee.

## ABSTRACT FORMAT GUIDELINES

- 1. Abstracts are limited to **2,250** characters. Each table or graph counts as 425 characters. Spaces and headings do not count as characters.
- 2. The title should be brief and should clearly indicate the nature of the investigation.
- 3. Type the name and location of the institution and the complete/full names, credentials held (including FACC/MACC), and principal degrees (including MD, BA, etc.) of all authors.
- 4. Content should be structured into four (4) sections:
  - Background
  - Methods
  - Results
  - Conclusions

## **ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

- 1. Completed abstracts must submitted online at <u>https://nyacc.wufoo.com/forms/z1i4hwyp1u3wx58/</u> by clicking on "**Upload Your Abstract.**" Please upload your document there.
  - 2. Completed abstracts must be submitted by 5 p.m. Eastern on Friday, Aug. 25, 2023.
  - 3. Incomplete submissions will not be processed. Verify your information carefully before submitting.
  - 4. Abstracts cannot be edited.
  - 5. Submission of an abstract constitutes **a commitment to present, either orally or by displaying a poster on site** for the length of the event. Failure to be present will jeopardize future acceptance of abstracts or cases.

#### **CLINICAL CASE FORMAT GUIDELINES**

- 1. The case description should be limited to one (1) typed page. The title should be brief and clearly indicate the nature of the investigation.
- 2. Type the name and location of the institution and the complete/full names, credentials held (including FACC/MACC), and principal degrees (including MD, BA, etc.) of all authors.
- 3. Describe the case, the diagnostic modalities, and the therapeutic procedures performed, as applicable, and separate the submission into three sections:
  - Case Report
  - Discussion
  - Conclusion
- 4. Discuss the unique aspects of the case that would merit presentation at our event.

- 2. Clinical cases must be submitted by 5 p.m. Eastern on Friday, Aug. 25, 2023.
- 3. Incomplete submissions will not be processed. Verify your information carefully before submitting.
- 4. Clinical cases cannot be edited.
- 5. Submission of a clinical case constitutes a commitment to present on site at the event. Failure to be present will jeopardize future acceptance of cases or abstracts.
